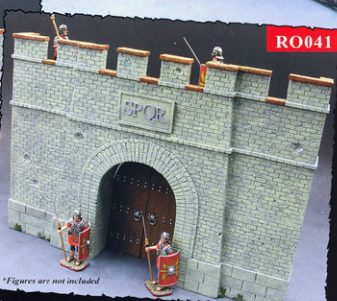
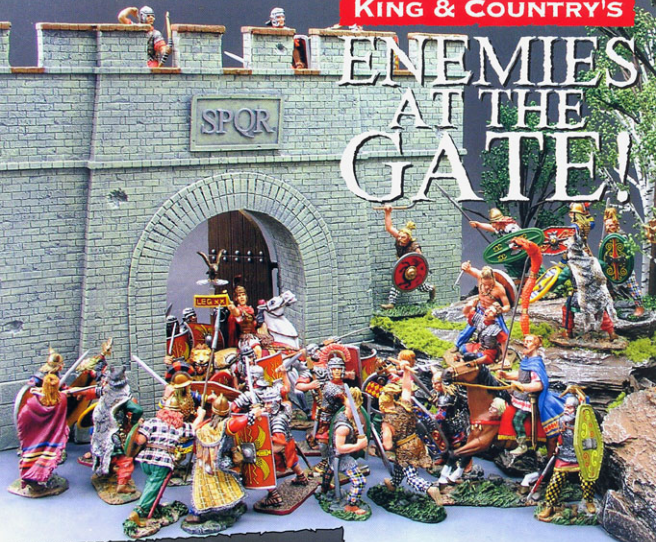

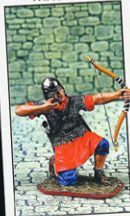

ABOUT OUR LEGIONNAIRES

Our Roman soldiers are from the period 100-150 A.D. Their armour is of the "Lorica Segmentata" type of overlapping (and flexible) panels held together by ribbon loops and pins. The helmets are of the "Brigetio" style originally from Hungary.

The long swords are of the "Pompeii" kind manufactured widely in the 1st Century A.D. and well into the 2nd Century. The spears are "Pila" and were primarily used for throwing.

In addition to their short "kilts" the Legionnaires also wear knee breeches called "feminalia" - particularly in colder climates.

On their feet the Legions wore leather sandals with hobnails studding each sole.

Our Roman archers by comparison are lightly armed and wearing "chain-mail" vests.
