FOR ALMOST 150 years, Comanche warriors were the "Lords of the Southern Plains"... During that time they drove out competing tribes and were a major obstacle to American expansion and settlement of this huge area.

In addition to commanding and terrorizing the Southern Plains they also sent raiding parties beyond its borders into Colorado... New Mexico... Kansas and even Mexico itself.

The Comanche's reign of terror throughout the Southern Plains was finally checked with the establishment of a chain of lonely forts and outposts manned by U.S. Dragoons.

These regular cavalry policed the overland trade and migration routes and provided much-needed protection and support for settlers whenever and wherever they could.

Small patrols were continuously being sent out to prevent marauding Comanche from attacking the few settled areas within the territory. In the years before the outbreak of the Civil War many future commanders first gained practical soldiering experience with the Dragoons on the frontier. Probably the most famous was the legendary Confederate cavalry officer J.E.B. Stuart.

OUR FIRST RELEASE

Is the officer of this small group of horsemen... Drawing his cavalry sabre he is determined to strike down one of his enemies.

All of these dramatic figures are wearing typical pre-Civil War Dragoon uniform with forage cap.

RAIDING PARTY

Usually, most Indian tribes would make themselves scarce when they

saw regular cavalry approaching... the Comanche however had a reputation for standing their ground and putting up a fierce fight.

These five warriors are no exception...

TRW004

Portrays a mounted Comanche on his favourite war pony. Reigning in his horse he prepares to wield his long lance with lethal effect.

TRW005

Another warrior, shield in one hand, has his tomahawk ready.

TRW006

Yet one more Comanche rushes into the attack with rifle and raised tomahawk.

TRW007

This third warrior on foot gets ready to use his knife on one of the Dragoons's horses.

TRW008

The last Comanche quickly reloads his musket to take another shot, if he gets the chance, at the attacking Dragoons.

These first eight figures are just the "advance party" of a whole range of "Western-themed" subjects that are going to explore the exciting early frontier of America in the years before the outbreak of the great Civil War.
